 - **Part 1:** Create an original **Funko POP!** Demigod Character based on your own life, personality, and interests. You should include the following in both your design and the written component. Please write your information in the character biography section on the template and the summary of your quest on a separate sheet of notebook paper and glue to the back of your POP! template.
 - Your godly parent (make sure explain why)
 - Your demigod powers
 - A symbolic item or weapon
 - A modern-day setting of your choice
 - A small summary of your "demigod quest"
 - This should be in the narrative style, have an appropriate beginning, middle, and end, and be at least two paragraphs long
 - ~3-6 sentences per paragraph

Part 2: This part should be TYPED, PRINTED and submitted in person. Using the book of your choice, and this prompt you will complete the following:

Prompt: What makes the person in your book of choice a real life hero? Think about what they went through, how they responded, and why their story matters.

- 1. Write a clear thesis statement that answers the prompt.
 - a. Your thesis should tell us your main idea in one sentence.
- 2. Support your thesis with 2-3 pieces of evidence from the book
 - a. These can be moments, actions, or quotes that show why the person is heroic.
- 3. Wrap it up with a reflection
 - a. In 2-3 sentences, explain why this story matters to you or what you learned from it.
